## Workshop Briefs:

### 1. Westminster's Response to Serious Youth Violence

There have been several incidents of serious youth violence in the past few months in the North West of the borough. Accordingly there are high levels of concern amongst parts of the community. Serious youth violence and gang related activity is a priority for Westminster City Council and the Metropolitan Police Service. This is reflected by in the priorities of the Safer Westminster Partnership, the control strategy for Westminster police and locally in the priorities set by the resident led Safer Neighbourhoods ward panels.

#### Overview of incidents of recent serious youth violence:

- On the 29<sup>th</sup> September three young girls – ages 17, 18 and 19 - were victims of shotgun wounds on John Fearon walk, Mozart estate. All three teenage girls received injuries that required hospital treatment. One of the three girls was holding an 11 month old baby at the time of the attack, but the baby luckily escaped injury. All three girls have since been released from hospital. Operation Trident are investigating and so far one arrest has been made in connection with this incident.
- On the 3rd October a stabbing occurred on the Amberley Estate at the rear of the youth centre by the side of Clearwell Drive. A young person was stabbed several times in the leg. Five suspects were arrested at the scene on suspicion of grievous bodily harm.
- On the 11<sup>th</sup> October a young male entered Paddington police station with a shotgun injury to his head. He stated that he and three friends were approached by a group of males whilst walking along the canal towpath and they were chased into Hall Road where the victim was shot. Victim received first aid and was taken to hospital where his condition was reported as stable. A young male was subsequently arrested in connection with this incident.

#### What are we doing?

- Westminster is currently developing a 'Your Choice' diversion programme which will deliver a clear and direct message to young people involved in serious youth violence that they face a choice; either accept opportunities and support or face swift action against them. For those that are at risk of involvement in serious youth violence, we will provide targeted prevention and intervention support in order to avoid gang culture and choose a positive future. Key elements of the programme include getting young offenders and those at risk into sustained employment, supporting parents in dealing with children's involvement in gang activity, a gang exit support package for those gang members who choose to leave gang life and a streamlined intelligence sharing process, through a Gang Information Desk, with a co-located team between the Council and Metropolitan Police Borough Intelligence Unit.
- We are working closely with the police to build evidence against those participating in serious youth violence using enforcement options such as Anti Social Behaviour Orders (ASBOs), gang injunctions and housing tenancy action where appropriate to restrict their negative behaviours.
- Close working between the Neighbourhood Crime Reduction Service and Locality Young People's Services (LYPS) and the Metropolitan police has enabled us to ensure that young people at risk of serious youth violence are identified, monitored

and engaged with. LYPS also offers a number of diversionary activities for young people, including PAYP (Positive Activities for Young People), Equipped to go diversion bus, as well as trialling a gang mediation project bringing together Westminster young people with those in rivals gangs across the borders of Brent and Kensington & Chelsea boroughs.

## 2. Changes to One Stop Services

This workshop session will provide information on the closure of the traditional One Stop Service and the ways you can transact with Westminster in the future.

City Hall One Stop closed on 23<sup>rd</sup> August 2011 and this will be followed by Harrow Road and Church Street One Stops closing on 16<sup>th</sup> December 2011. In the lead up to the closure, the two remaining One Stop Services will stop accepting cash and cheque payments from 1<sup>st</sup> November 2011.

Westminster has increased the ways and places its customers can transact. From the 1<sup>st</sup> November you will be able to pay bills and apply for services at your local Post Office by cash, cheque or card.

We have set up 'Your One Stop Express' self serve computers and free phones in convenient locations across the City including libraries and community centres where you can carry out your transactions with Westminster, online, with assistance from a member of staff or speak to a customer service expert on the phone.

Parking Services are now accepting online permit applications for first time, renewals and changes to existing permits removing the need to carry out the transaction at a One Stop Service and providing customers with the convenience of transacting at home or at work.

### **3. A more efficient Council – update on plans and your suggestions**

As a result of the reduction in the level of grant the City Council receives from Central Government, the council has this year needed to look at ways of becoming more efficient so that we can protect front line services as much as possible.

Some examples of what we have already done to save £60m in 2011/12 include:

- Reviewing and renegotiating contracts with our outsource partners to reduce costs.
- Maximising revenue raising opportunities
- Re-organising management and back office functions to reduce costs
- Using preventative services to avoid more intensive and costly interventions later
- Working more closely with other public sector partners to remove duplicated effort

However we need to save a further £24m in 2012/13.

Some of this can be delivered as a direct consequence of the initiatives delivered this year.

Some additional examples of initiatives we are thinking about include:

- Further reductions in staff by sharing services across three boroughs.
- Adjusting licensing and planning fees in line with legislation currently going through Parliament.
- Developing a new commercial model for the management of public conveniences

## 4. Traffic Management plans for the Olympics

### Olympic venues and events

Westminster will host:

#### Games venues

- Beach volleyball at Horse Guards Parade, St. James's Park and The Mall
- Archery at Lord's Cricket Ground
- Triathlon and marathon swimming competitions in Hyde Park.

#### Road events

- The Olympic Torch Relay
- Ten road races
- The celebration parade.

#### Open air sites

- Hyde Park will host a big screen known as a live site, showing coverage of the Olympics. There may also be appearances from athletes
- Trafalgar Square will host the Paralympic live site.

#### Buildings

- The International Olympic Committee will stay in hotels on Park Lane
- The London Media Centre will be based at One Great George Street
- Eight venues are likely to host National Houses, including Brazil at Somerset House.

### Transport

Transport during the 2012 Games is crucial to its success. We need to ensure that residents, businesses, visitors and athletes can get around the city. To ensure that extra pedestrians are safely managed and that athletes get to events on time, Transport for London (TfL) will make temporary changes to Westminster's roads during the Games next summer.

Following an engagement period by Transport for London, a series of traffic regulation orders on the Olympic Route Network have been submitted for Lord's Cricket Ground. Statutory consultations on regulations from Marylebone Road to Great Portland Street will take place from 4<sup>th</sup> November. Other sections of the ORN in the central London Zone are expected to open later in the month.

The dates of operation will vary to reflect the Games timetable and related demand. Road closures and other measures will be introduced as late as possible and will be removed as early as possible. The council has been working with TfL to reduce the impact on residents and businesses.

Additional measures to manage traffic and parking around Lord's are also being developed. These changes may include temporary parking controls on event days and traffic changes at peak times. Residents and businesses will still be able to park near their properties. Arrangements will also be made to ensure everyday activities such as deliveries can continue. These plans will be available early next year.

### **Moving people around the city**

Movement Management measures mean that vehicle access to Whitehall, Parliament Street and Charing Cross Road and the Royal Parks will be restricted. This will enable large numbers of pedestrians going to and from the beach volleyball at Horse Guards Parade to spill onto the road safely. At peak times wider areas such as Mayfair, which will be impacted by the up to 85,000 capacity Live Site at Hyde Park, will be subject to restrictions. This will have an impact on parking, access may be restricted and diversions for deliveries may be in place.

### **Freight**

As a result of the road changes we expect an increase in freight between midnight and 6am. To help minimise the impact on residents TfL will roll out a code of conduct for freight carriers and waste collection companies across London. They are recruiting businesses including retailers and the leisure industry to London boroughs to take part in trials to test the effectiveness of the code. The council is working with TfL to shape the trial.

### **Licensing**

The council does not propose relaxing licensing hours during the Olympic and Paralympic Games as this could disturb local residents and would also reduce the time available for overnight cleansing and deliveries. Licensing applications will be considered on a case by case basis.

### **Dressing the city**

Much of central Westminster and the areas surrounding Olympic and Paralympic venues will be dressed in London 2012 colours. The council is working with the GLA, LOCOG (who are organising the Games) and the Business Improvement Districts to confirm plans to dress the city.

### **Legacy**

- Schools can sign up for the Get Set Network to receive free tickets for one in eight London schoolchildren aged 10-18 for the Olympic and Paralympic Games. Ask your schools to sign up at [www.getset.london2012.com](http://www.getset.london2012.com) by 16<sup>th</sup> December to avoid your children missing out.
- Westminster's Arts and Culture service is awarding grants of up to £2,500 to groups and residents wanting to be part of the Cultural Olympics. - Two residents who have been nominated for an ActiveWestminster award will be put forward as Olympic torch bearers.
- The council has won an Olympic Inspire Mark for 12 community sports programmes – see [www.westminster.gov.uk/active](http://www.westminster.gov.uk/active)
- Many of the public realm and public transport developments linked to the Games will benefit residents and visitors for years to come, for example the new entrance to Green Park tube station.

#### **All Sing! Harrow Road Community Choir**

**Provider: Harrow Road Community Choir (Charity); Cost: £4,023 allocated for autumn and winter terms 2011-12.**

Funding was originally allocated to support the choirs' development over the first 6 months of 2011. The choir remains extremely successful, attracting an average group of 40 local residents to each weekly rehearsal at the Paddington Academy as well as performing a number of concerts. The new funding committed for September 2011 onwards, has already helped leverage additional external funding for the choir.

#### **Christmas Tree and Lights**

**Provider: Abraxus; Cost: £4,161.18**

Christmas tree and lights to be installed on the Maida Hill Piazza from November 2011-January 2012. Switch on event planned for Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> December.

### Little Venice:

#### **Second Weekly Recycling Scheme for Eligible Streets 2011-12**

**Provider: Recycling Service; Cost: £29,354.00**

This project will see additional doorstep recycling collections across the ward, continuing from the project started previously. The second collection day was changed from Saturday to Friday and this is continuing for 2011-12.

#### **Installation of Hanging Baskets**

**Provider: Parks; Cost: £15,544.87**

The ward budget has funded the installation of hanging baskets at locations throughout the ward, to be planted twice in the year. In July 2011, 69 baskets were installed.

#### **Street Sign for Little Venice Sports Centre**

**Provider: Transportation; Cost: £196.20**

A street sign has been put up at the junction of Crompton Street and Edgware Road to direct pedestrians to the Little Venice Sports Centre.

#### **Contribution towards Halloween Event on Paddington Green Estate**

**Provider: CWH; Contribution: £700**

Halloween event planned for local families on Monday 31<sup>st</sup> October from 4-7pm.

**Festive Lights in Clifton Road****Provider: Abraxus; Cost: £ 1,489.18**

Festive lights due to be installed at the end of November 2011.

**Maida Vale:****Installation of Hanging Baskets 2011-12****Provider: Parks; Cost: £19,421.10**

The ward budget has funded the installation of hanging baskets at locations throughout the ward, to be planted twice in the year. In June 2011, 126 baskets were installed.

**St Augustine's School Playground Refurbishment****Provider: St Augustine's School; Cost: £15,998.83**

The ward budget is contributing to the cost of refurbishing the playground at St Augustine's school so that it provided somewhere to climb, quiet areas with plants for talking and relaxing, somewhere to perform and a multi-purpose pitch with built in football and hockey goals and basketball hoops. The playground will be the hub for the after-school playcentre/childcare provision for the Maida Vale Ward and so will be used by primary pupils from the whole local community.

**Festive Lights on Elgin Avenue****Provider: Abraxus; Cost: £ 982.09**

Festive lights will be installed in street trees outside Maida Vale tube station. Small switch-on event planned for the end of November 2011 with local school children.

**Queen's Park:****Bright Ideas Fund for Secondary School Pupils****Provider: tbc; Costs: £2,000**

Pupils from 4 secondary schools in the north of the borough to be invited to submit project ideas for funding. A joint school event with pupils is being planned for December 2011. The best ideas will be developed in conjunction with the schools and awarded funding.

**Fireworks Display, November 2011****Provider: PDT; Contribution: £1,000**

Fireworks display planned for Queen's Park gardens on the 5<sup>th</sup> November 2011.

**St Jude's Youth Club sessions****Provider: London Tigers; Contribution: £4,500**

Youth club sessions take place at St Jude's community Hall, every Tuesday and Friday, from 6-9pm. Sunday sports sessions at the Moberly are also supervised by the club.

**LED lights in street tree at Ha'Penny Steps site on Harrow Road****Provider: Piggotts; Cost: £3,500**

LED lights will be installed in the new mature tree by the Ha'Penny Steps Bridge at the end of November 2011. Lights will remain in the tree for a period of 3 years, but will only be lit through the winter periods (November – March each year).

**Pilates sessions at the Moberly Sports Centre, August 2011****Provider: Westminster Sports Unit; Cost: £106.28 - COMPLETE****One Day singing event at the Beethoven Centre****Provider: All Sing! Community Choir; Cost: £535**

Event took place on Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> September 2011. The event was targeted at local families encouraging them to join the popular community choir.

Note: The lighting improvements schemes will be largely be lantern replacement schemes with the in-fill columns when required.
