BYELAWS TO PREVENT THE FEEDING OF BIRDS

BYELAWS made by the Council of the City of Westminster under Section 235 of the Local Government Act 1972 for the good rule and government of the City of Westminster and for the prevention and suppression of nuisances.

EXTENT

- 1 (1) These Byelaws apply to those areas in the City of Westminster identified in the Schedule to these Byelaws and hatched in red on the plan attached.
- (2) Notice of the effect of these Byelaws shall be given by signs placed in such positions within the areas identified in the Schedule as the Council may consider adequate.

INTERPRETATION

- 2 In these Byelaws:
 - "the Council" means Westminster City Council;
 - "feeding stuff" includes any proprietary pigeon or similar bird feed, seeds, bread or any other similar product; and any other food which is being used to specifically attract birds or which is likely to attract birds.

FEEDING OF BIRDS PROHIBITED

- 3 No person shall within any area in the City of Westminster identified in the Schedule to these Byelaws –
 - (1) feed any bird (which shall include dropping or casting feeding stuff for birds); or
 - (2) distribute any feeding stuff for birds.

PENALTY

- 4 Any person offending against these Byelaws shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 2 on the standard scale.

SCHEDULE

The byelaws shall apply to the entire area in the City of Westminster hatched in red on the attached plan, which area includes the following:

St Martin's Place in its entirety.

The southernmost part of Charing Cross Road comprising footways and carriageway extending from its junction with St Martin's Place to the north east corner of the National Portrait Gallery in line with lamp column 50 on the west side and the bank at 2b Charing Cross Road in line with lamp column 49 on the east side.

Those parts of William IV Street extending west beyond the building line of 6-8 St Martin's Place.

Those parts of St Martin's Lane extending south beyond the building line of the southern façade of 10 St Martin's Place.

Church Walk in its entirety and all parts of Adelaide Street adjacent to and east of the St Martins-in-the-Fields boundary wall and railings.

Duncannon Street in its entirety.

Trafalgar Square in its entirety including footways, carriageway and the garden and forecourt of the National Gallery, save for that part of the central island administered by the Greater London Authority.

The westernmost part of the Strand comprising footways and carriageway adjacent to and south of the southern façade of South Africa House, and adjacent to and north of the north west elevation of Grand Buildings (1-3 The Strand).

The northernmost part of Northumberland Avenue comprising footways and carriageway adjacent to and south of the Grand Buildings Arcade to its southernmost point, and to 4 Northumberland Avenue on the opposite side.

The northernmost part of Whitehall comprising footways and carriageway north of 12 Whitehall on the west side and 15 Whitehall on the east side.


The traffic island immediately to the south of Trafalgar Square (being the former site of Charing Cross) and all carriageway and footways around it, extending toward Admiralty Arch to the junction with Spring Gardens (north) and Spring Gardens (south).

Cockspur Street from its junction with Trafalgar Square westward to the eastern limit of the façade of 2-4 Cockspur Street on the north side, and on the south side by a point on the façade of 25 to 28 Cockspur Street immediately opposite.

The eastern part of Pall Mall East, comprising carriageway and both north and south footways faced onto by the façade of 13-17 Pall Mall east and the entire area fronted onto by the facades of the National Gallery Sainsbury wing and Canada House, to the junction with Trafalgar Square.

The area of footway between the National Gallery Sainsbury Wing and the National Gallery, from Trafalgar Square to a line parallel with and 10 metres to the north of the southernmost of the metal gates connecting the two buildings.
