An aggregate score of 16 from 16 for progress in establishing comprehensive CAMHS services 4. No increase in obesity levels amongst children aged under 11 between 2006-7 and 2008-9 5. 65% of schools to achieve Healthy Schools status by 2007-08 6. 93% of children and young people participate in 2+ hours sport per week by 2008-09 7. 15% of young people aged 15-24 years screened for chlamydia in 2007-08 in new programme 8. To increase the percentage of young people supported for substance misuse by 75% between 2005-06 and 2007-08	1. 75%-100% of schools sign and implement the DFES Charter for action on anti-bullying by March 2008 2. 2,715 referrals of victims of domestic violence to Westminster Victim Support and Woman's Trust Advocacy Service 3. 34% of domestic violence perpetrators being brought to justice 4. Rate of re-registration to the CPR remains between 10 and 15% each year 5. Less than 10% of children on the CPR for 2+ yrs when de-registered each year 6. Pimlico Secondary School is taken out of special measures by March 2008 6. 95.2% attendance at primary schools, 93.7% attendance at secondary schools during the 2008-09 academic year 7. 10% fall in fixed term and permanent exclusions between 2004-05 and 2007-08 academic years 8. 60% of children leaving care have at least 1 GCSE at grades A*-G by 2008-09 9. Less than 10% of looked after children miss 25 or more days during the 2008-09 school year 10. No children in mainstream primary schools wait more than 8 months for a speech and language therapy assessment by 2008-09 11. Pupils with SEN achieve at or above the national average for pupils with SEN (Key Stage 2 in maths and English, and GCSE)	1. 15% of the 13-19 population in "contact" with youth services each year 2. 30% of participants in youth work gain an accreditation each year 3. 60% of primary school pupils say they have lots to do near home by 2008-09 4. 7,200 young people participate in elections to the Youth Parliament in between 2006-07 and 2008-09 5. 60 volunteering opportunities for 200 young people to be provided by February 2009 6. 5% reduction in the number of new entrants to the youth justice system by 2007-08 (2005-06 baseline) 7. 5% reduction in recidivism amongst the 2006 cohort (baseline 2002 cohort) 8. 9% reduction in the use of the secure estate for remands of the total number of remand episodes, excluding unconditional bail 9. 5% reduction in the number of custodial sentences as proportion of all court disposals 10. Less than 50% of residents feel that parents do not take responsibility for the behaviour of their children	1. 70% of young people achieve a level 2 qualification by age 19 for 2007-08 cohort 2. 52% of young people achieve a level 3 qualification by age 19 for 2007-08 cohort 3. 60% of teenage mothers in EET by 2010 (national target) 4. 90% of young offenders in EET by 2007-08 5. 80% of young people with LDD in EET by 2008-09 6. 13% of WBL opportunities are taken up by young people with LDD by 2008-09 7. 200 lone parents supported into sustained employment or training during by end of 2007-08 8. A childcare sufficiency assessment is completed by June 2007 (Targets on provision of affordable childcare and take up of Working Families Tax Credits to be agreed following publication) 9. Secure 150 homes to meet the needs of overcrowded families 10. Provide a programme of after school activities for at least 200 children living in overcrowded conditions
